- PhD Consortium to improve knowledge exchange between CCUS (and other) industry and academia
 - Biannual event/conference
- Academic research is informed by industry needs and develops industry useable knowledge and tools
- Industry is aware of and informed by latest research advances
- Industry uptake of research
 - Subsurface and related areas of research for energy transition and net zero
 - Technical
 - Policy
 - Legal
 - Social
 - Economic

Membership

- Industry entry level
 - all presentations
 - up to 8 attendees at biannual conference
- Industry leader level
 - all presentations
 - unlimited attendees at conferences
 - sponsor and steer one PhD project



Objectives

Primary

- Improve knowledge exchange between industry and academia
- 50 PhDs and Postdocs from SCCS partners to present results to industry/business/regulators every 6 months
- Receive regular industry *feedback*

Secondary

- Funding of PhD studentships for specific projects
- Receive regular industry steer



Outcomes

- Better informed research (by industrial needs)
- Better integrated research (across CCS chain & related areas, across Scottish universities)
- Uptake of research findings and application by industry
- Development of new industry focused research and training activities
- Development of industry funding streams
- PhDs & PDRAs better prepared to work in CCS/carbon management industry
- Improved recruitment for PhDs & PDRAs into CCS/carbon management industry
- Improve expertise & employability of industry personnel
