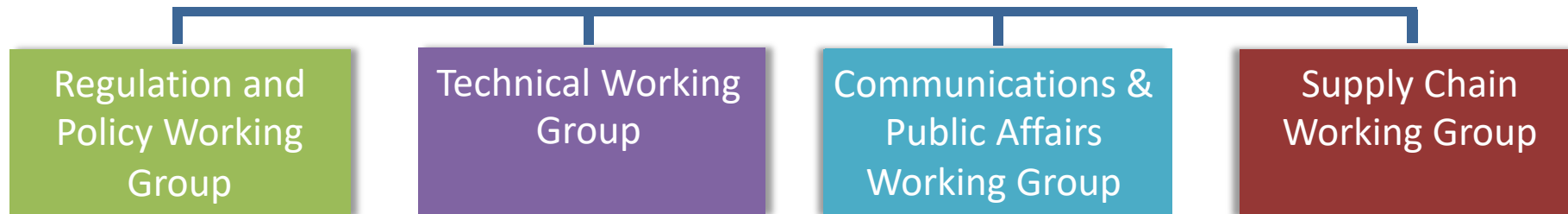

- Working groups currently meet quarterly (or as relevant) and we encourage members to field representatives (with relevant experience) to each working group (**there is no limit to the number of representatives that can take part in working groups**).

**UK to propose carbon border tax as part of steel industry aid package**

[23rd January] The UK is to propose a carbon border tax that would place a levy on imported steel as part of a £600m support package to help Britain's two biggest steelmakers invest in greener technologies and avert the loss of thousands of jobs. Jeremy Hunt, the chancellor, has agreed to consult on ways to level the playing field for British Steel and Tata Steel UK against competitors based in regions with lower environmental standards or lower operating costs. One option will be the introduction of a carbon border adjustment mechanism, similar to the one agreed by the EU last year, that will force importers to cover the cost of the carbon emissions of the foreign steel, said two people familiar with the situation.

**North West Industrial Decarbonisation Plan Hailed as Pivotal Moment for UK's Journey to Net Zero – Hydrogen Production**

[24th January] North west industrial decarbonisation plan hailed as pivotal moment for UK's journey to net zero – hydrogen production. A powerful collaboration of industry leaders has set out a roadmap to decarbonisation for the UK's first net zero cluster. The North West Cluster Plan published by Net Zero North West (19th January) sets out the action needed to supercharge the region's green industrial revolution and deliver the UK's first zero carbon cluster by 2040. Unveiled by Andy Carter MP at an event at the Greater Manchester Chamber of Commerce, the Cluster Plan demonstrates a £30bn pipeline of live investable projects with the opportunity for £207bn to be invested in the region overall.

**New technique from U.S. national lab promises to strip carbon dioxide emissions from power plants and factories at record-low cost**

[24th January] Scientists at one of the country's premier research labs have discovered a record-cheap way to capture carbon dioxide as it's emitted from power plants and factories, including the likes of iron and steel manufacturing facilities. Globally, industrial processes are responsible for 31 percent of total greenhouse gas emissions and electricity generation accounts for 27 percent, according to Bill Gates in his climate book, dwarfing the 16 percent of total greenhouse gas emissions that comes from the transportation sector.

[25th January] Nippon Steel is considering capturing carbon dioxide emissions from its Japanese steel mills for underground storage at facilities linked to Exxon Mobil in counties including Australia, Malaysia and Indonesia, Nikkel has learned.
